CREATING COMMUNITY-WIDE IMPACT

United Way of Calvert County's goal is to create long-lasting change in our community. Last year we started a five-year funding committment to 16 programs that are improving the health, education, and financial stability of people in Calvert County through our Community Impact Grants. Below are some of the results from the first year. Just imagine what can be accomplished by the time we get to 2022!

> face-to-face visits with a local mental health professional were provided to children & adolescents who are uninsured or underinsured

women who began their pregnancies with a substance abuse disorder tested negative for illegal drugs upon delivery

> incarcerated fathers completed 12 weeks of classes with the goal of becoming healthy role models for their children upon release

students were provided 194 days of after-school activities



5th-12th graders attended field trips to learn about the importance of making healthy choices

BASIC NEEDS
